

Barn Owl

Barn Owls are under threat because changing farming practices have reduced the amount of habitat and food available, as well as removing their favourite nest sites hollow trees and old barns.

Biodiversity Action Plans provide a list of actions that need to be taken to ensure the conservation of particular habitats and species. In the case of the Barn Owl these actions include:

Finding out where Barn Owls are found.

Create new habitat.

Link existing habitats through habitat corridors.

Erect nest boxes in areas of suitable habitat.
