



Barn Owl

Barn Owls are under threat because changing farming practices have reduced the amount of habitat and food available, as well as removing their favourite nest sites - hollow trees and old barns.

Biodiversity Action Plans provide a list of actions that need to be taken to ensure the conservation of particular habitats and species. In the case of the Barn Owl these actions include:

- Finding out where Barn Owls are found.
- Create new habitat.
- Link existing habitats through habitat corridors.
- Erect nest boxes in areas of suitable habitat.
